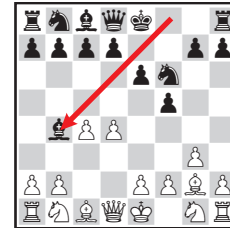

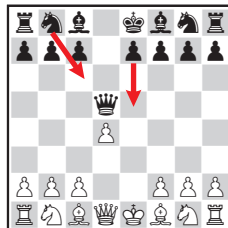

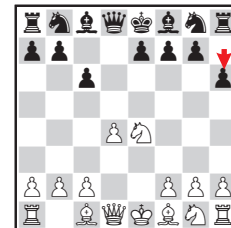

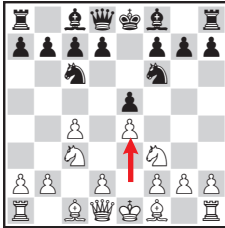

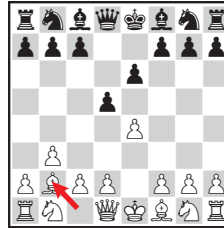


Four Knights with 4.e4

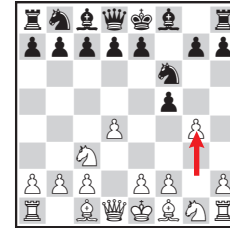

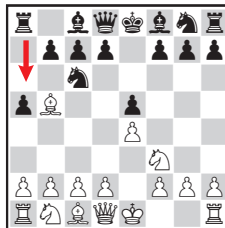

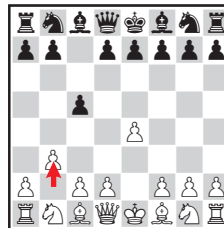

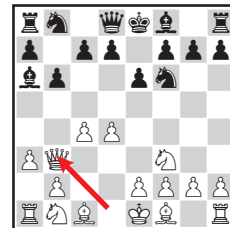
